Many people immediately know what this flag stands for, and it is often used to represent gay pride. There are other well-known flags such as the bisexual flag, striped with blue, pink, and purple. The blue represents attraction to the opposite gender, the pink represents attraction to the same gender, and the purple is the attraction to more than one gender. There is also a flag representing the transgender community. The two blue stripes are associated with the male gender, the two pink stripes are for the female gender, and the white stripe in the middle represents people who are transitioning. In 2014, a flag was created for nonbinary people, with yellow, white, purple, and black stripes, representing people with many/different genders, people without a gender, those who fall between male and female/are a mix of both, and those who do not fall within the term 'binary gender.' According to Encyclopedia Britannica, in 1978, Gilbert Baker, a gay man, decided to create this pride flag because he found that a flag was the best way to show pride. The flag is striped with the colors hot pink, red, orange, yellow, green, turquoise, indigo, and violet. These hues represent sexuality, life, healing, sunlight, nature, art, serenity, and spirit.

Joelle Joanie “JoJo” Siwa is an 18-year old American social media personality, dancer, singer, and more. BIOGRAPHY ON TODRICK HALL

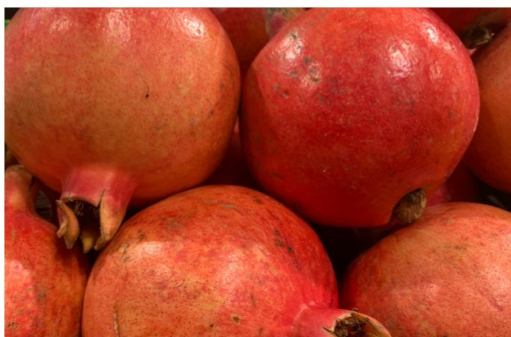

Hall realized he was gay when he was in high school; he came out to his family at 15. According to past interviews, he recalls that it took a couple years for them to fully accept him for who he was.

At 16, Hall first entered the performing industry. Since then, he has appeared on YouTube, Broadway, and most notably, *American Idol*. He has also written and produced his own music, a large amount of which details his experience as a black gay man in society.

In November of 2016, Hall took on the role of Lola in Broadway's *Kinky Boots*. He was offered the lead "without auditioning" due to his similarity to the character and past work in the music industry and on the show *RuPaul's Drag Race*.

In May of 2021, Hall publicly announced a relationship with model David Boris, further cementing his self-confidence and impact on the black gay community. He has inspired so many already, and with projects up ahead, is sure to remain an LGBTQ+ icon for years ahead.

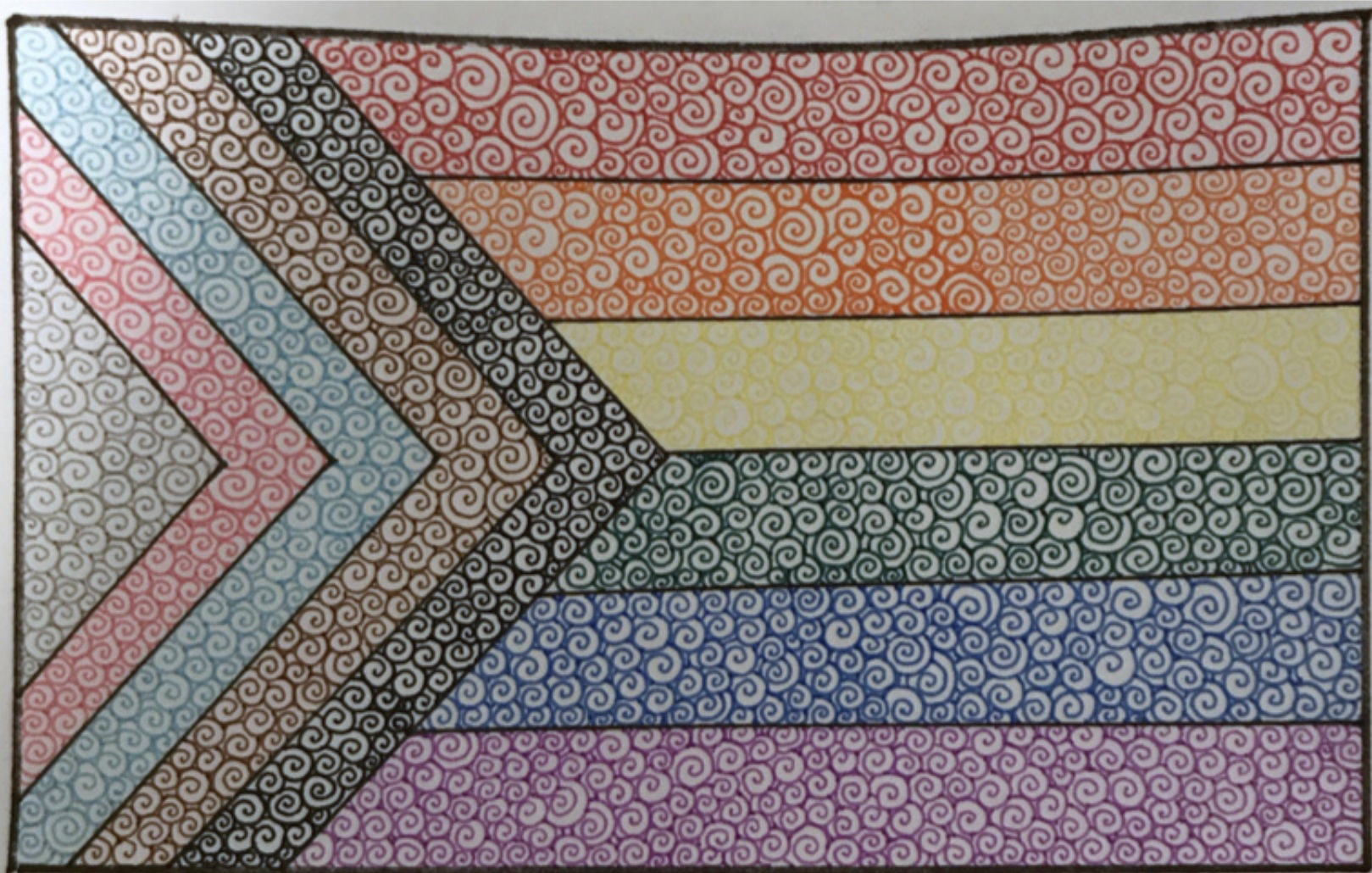
